HIGHWAYS PERFORMACE SPACE AND THEIR PROVOCATIVE POSTCARD MAILINGS



Highways, located in Santa Monica, California, is a theatre performance space for artists looking to explore progressive and alternative works of theatre, music, dance, spoken work and interactive media. From its small beginnings in 1989, it has always been receptive to the works of LGBTQ artists.

In order to promote its events to the public, Highways has used the mails to publicize such events, frequently in the form of postcard mailings. Some of these mailings have been quite provocative, to say the least. Two such mailings are shared.

The first event, from May of 2008, promoted an event called *Brief Buddies*. While one side of the card gave the recipient all the details of the who, what, where and when of the event, the other side presented a rather suggestive photo of the lower portion of two men's legs, with their underwear briefs positioned around their ankles. No one could argue that such a mailing was not going to be noticed.





Even more scandalous, and in celebration of Valentines Day and a nod to the 16th president of the United States, Highways presented a fundraising event title *Abraham Lincoln's Big Gay Valentine's Bash* in February of 2010. Once again, the particulars of the event are offered on the address side of the card, while the steamy side of the card showed a picture of Honest Abe's head superimposed on the body of muscular nude man, holding what appears to be a spear and reclining on what appears to be leopard skin throw rug. Outrageous, you might say, but both cards were delivered to their destination without running afoul of any content restrictions that the United States Postal Service may have had in place.
